

The NBA All-Star Game's Popularity Crisis: A Discourse Analysis and Strategic Interventions

Abstract: National Basketball Association (NBA) All-Star Game is also a celebrity event of the NBA where NBA stars involve themselves in an event once again in the month of February for three days selecting two baskets of the best players originating from the East and West sides. However, the impact of this game now is getting smaller and smaller and smaller. The paper is going to discover the ways of making NBA All-Star Games popular again. At that, there are several methods of its solution. But more super stars need to be created for the NBA, this will assist NBA in attracting more fans. They should also enhance the voting system, and they vote for valuable players instead of the fans voting all the players in the league.

1 INTRODUCTION

The NBA All-Stars began in 1951. This was the suggestion of Haske Cohen, then head of public relations at NBA headquarters. Originally, Cohen was just trying to parody the All-Star Game of the National Major League Baseball. The All-Star Game of baseball is scheduled to be held in the middle of each season, so the NBA All-Star Game follows this custom. In the fall of 1950, just four years after the NBA was founded, it began to decline. Podolov, the first president of the NBA, and Walter Brown, the president of the Boston Celtics, agreed to select the best players from the East and West Divisions (the only 11 teams in the NBA at the time) to play a game halfway through the season. March 2, 1951, Brown, president of the Boston Celtics gave the Boston Garden Coliseum for the purpose of holding the first All-Star Game (Humphreys and Johnson, 2019 & Li, 2022). The overall form of the modern All-Star Game has turned into the All-Star Weekend, which appears to be a three-day event and consists of All-Star Party, Rookie All-Star Challenge, Slam Dunk Contest, Three-Point Shot, Basketball Skill Challenge, Shooting Relay Race, as well as All-Star Game. Of all the most entertaining are the “Slam Dunk Contest” and the “All-Star Game”. The first slam dunk in the competition happened in 1984 when the performer was Larry Nance of the Phoenix Suns; he adopted The name “Thunderbolt Windmill” while holding a ball in his two hands flew and smashed both the balls into

the basket. In 1991, Dee Brown of the Celtics blindfolded his right arm and dunked a basketball with the ball in his left hand, and no one did it better than Ceballos, who made it the trademark “Deadly Bat” for the championship in 1992. Some of them include The nickname Jordan of the Bulls earned in 198y when he flew to the basket from the free throw line. Furthermore, during All-Star Weekend fans and journalists can watch other competitions and performances including the Million Dollar Pitch Contest (Liu, 2022 & Bian et al., 2022 & Ji and Li, 2013).

The paper is going to discuss why The NBA All-Star Game is less popular than the NBA All-Star Games a few years ago and how this problem can be solved.

2 NBA ALL-STAR GAME – HISTORY OF BASKETBALL EVENT

The NBA All-Star event is unique in the realm of basketball and one which has a rather interesting and dynamic stage, which spans back several years.

This whole thing started in the same year 1951 under the idea of NBA’s public relations director Haskell Cohen who wanted to replicate the formula of the All-Star Game of Major League Baseball. The first of these was staged at the Boston Garden thanks to the support of the owner of the Portland Trail

Blazers, Walt Brown, and the attendance of 10,094 fans became the basis for this traditional event. Originally it was just a friendly match that involved the best players of the Eastern and the Western Conference.

The All-Star Game was nonetheless established and went through constant changes over the years. The first significant advancement was in 1984 when Slam Dunk Contest started in Denver All-Star Game thus making the event more attractive. The second part was the incorporation of the Three-Point Contest two years later in Dallas. All these events form a very big part of the All-Star Weekend and have compelled fans from all over the world.

Traditionally, the NBA All-Star Game has always been full of interesting events and incredible demonstrations. Greatest of all time like Michael Jordan, Kobe Bryant, and LeBron James have produced imprints. Some time on global basketball will never forget Michael Jordan, who in early 1988 shocked everyone with his acrobatic skills and scoring prowess. There are two appearances of Kobe Bryant in the show and both of them played MVP performances. LeBron James has always remained a force to reckon with as he breaks records on the number of appearances and storms to his team's victories several occasions.

There is another very important issue connected with the voting on All-Star Game. At first, it used only fan votes later on it was done through the fans, players and media to have a better all-inclusive selection of the starters. Finally, the coaches get to pick the reserves.

Subsequently, in the past few years, the NBA continued to modify the All-Star game format. The league reform in 2017 saw the elimination of the East-West conference split format and, instead, each governing body representative chose the teams from any of the all-stars from the two conferences directly using ballots by fans and media. This change has created some variability in the game which makes the game much more interesting.

The selection of players to participate in the All-Star Game also underwent certain transformations, and the voting system has turned from a purely fans' one to one that involve players and media, which adds a much fairer selection of players for the game.

They just finally fell off and are generally bad now. However, recently the popularity of NBA All-Star Game has drastically decreased. This has been made possible by the following; As mentioned earlier the nature of the NBA has continually evolved. Earlier, the league had a few big wigs and personalities that were to give a guarantee of quality

and entertaining matches. But now, the number of indications that the zachetki project still exists has sharply decreased, and many talented players are present. Illness and other reasons have also forced out some of the top players to miss the All – Star Games and thereby downing the event even further.

Not only does the line-up of players change and evolve but the very play concept of the All-Star Game has also done so too. In previous years it was a serious match between the champions of two conferences, for today it is a fun competition. The complexity is that most players are paying more attention to individually organized spectacles than striving for a win. This has been a blow to many fans who are likely to find a match as interesting and deserving of a close look and a tough match. The media environment and audience viewing habits have also brought this change. As we can see, in the context of digital media consumption, everyday people has easy access to a tremendous amount of entertainment materials through the social networks and various streaming services. They can get highlights and update of their favorite players daily basis, which makes the All-Star Game less unique. Further, more competitions and entertainment-related events for example – sports have discouraged potential viewers.

3 WHY FANS ARE NO LONGER EXCITED ABOUT THE NBA

The NBA All-Star Game, which was once one of the most looked forward to events in basketball that drew interest from fans all over the world has gradually reduced in popularity in recent years and seen a significant decline in popularity in recent years. That is why there are several reasons that contribute to this phenomenon.

One of the initial reasons is the shifting dynamics of the NBA itself. The league featured only a handful of wonderful and self-promoting superstars who enjoyed a cult following. These young men like Michael Jordan, Kobe Bryant and Shaquille O'Neal who performed extraordinarily on the floor and at the same time had that panache that made the event exciting was the All-Star game. They were insisting on the quality and intensity of the competition and spectacular shows on the field. However, in recent years, the abundance of such talents in the league

diminished, however, one can still find an abundance of awesome players. The absence of such strategic commanders has reduced some glamour of the All-Star Game. For instance, all recent All-Star Games have had certain leading lights missing through injury or another legitimate excuse, which makes the spectacle still less appealing.

Another factor has also been the change of the style of play in the All-Star Game that has impacted on the fan base wake. The game was previously characterized by this kind of nervous and highly competitive affair between the best performers from the two conferences; the Eastern and the Western. However, in the recent past, specifically within the last decade or so, the event has morphed into something of a practice event, where players appear to be more interested in demonstrating their skills and having the time of their lives without necessarily wanting to win. This has come as a result of a lack of competitiveness and reduced challenge needed by the people watching the game. Some players may engage in a mechanical performance thus the game becomes more of a casual free shoot than an intense combat. This is a big letdown for fans expecting a high-octane encounter between the best that the league can offer.

Another factor that has led to the disastrous stage is the change in media and the new cultural patterns of the show's audience. In today's society, it seems like the choices of possible entertainment are limitless even if one is going to use one hand of his hand. There is also more content available online from performance highlights and status updates from the players on the respective teams daily. All of this has cut down on how novel and unique the All-Star Game once was. Fans today do not have to wait for the tennis championship tournament of the year to see their stars in action. Further, other activities such as other sports and entertainment events have also risen and featured the attention of the target audience. For instance, e-sports and other huge leagues in sports have gained a lot of attention in the past years, not to mention the key audiences switching away from the NBA All-Star Game (Reilly et al., 2023).

The election process in regard to the All-Star Game has also elicited a lot of criticism and might have affected the popularity of the event. It has been a common practice where the voting system has the main aim of voting for the favorite players, but sometimes it goes wrong. They are fan voting, player voting, and media voting, and it is feasible that some deserving players were never selected for the All-Star Game, conversely some less deserving players may get selected by reason of popularity or other considerations. This has raised dissatisfaction from

fans who argue that the appropriateness of selecting players are not fully fair for the powerhouse teams or best talents in the game (Levine, 2019).

That is why the format of the All-Star Game and, in particular, its schedule has also become quite protracted and monotonous. The tradition of East and West teams' confrontation has been existing for many years and even some alterations like the captain's pick may not prove to be successful enough to bring a new breath to the competition. The timing can also be blamed on the location of the All-Star Game, which is in the middle of the season when the regular season is still on. It also allows fans who feel the break in the regular season hurts the momentum of their teams to become annoyed with the All-Star game instead of looking forward to it.

Additionally, the following are the causes of the reduced popularity of the NBA All-Star Game; the alteration of the league's dynamics, change of media, voting system, format and scheduling of the game. So to move back to the previous stage the NBA needs to solve them and look for ways to make the All-Star Game a competitive, interesting and important event for fans (Li, 2022).

4 PROPOSALS TO REGAIN INTEREST IN THE NBA ALL-STAR GAME

In view of the fact that the NBA All-Star Game's popularity has recently started to dwindle, the following can be done.

Firstly, that is why the NBA should pay special attention to developing and marketing new superstars. The league can come up with other advertising appeals that portray talented young players and their personalities. For instance, in manufacturing well-researched documentaries or short clips about these players as was done during past legends. This would assist in creating a new generation of fan favorites would in turn build the star power of the All-Star game.

Secondly, the league has to improve the competitiveness of the game format in order to produce meaningful changes. One possibility might be the establishment of rewards regarding All-Star Game triumphs. For example, the winners could receive the organisation's charitable contribution in their name, or have some input into the draft pool of the teams of the participating players. It would urge individuals to take the game to the next level and would make the game much more competitive.

In the elections, the message to send in the voting system is that it needs to be simple. A less 'meta' system that involves the fans but removes some of the complications and pitfalls seen above should be created. The NBA could use a system where fan votes count but are given a proper but not complete percentage while using the panel of experts' evaluations to make the right selections.

In response to competition for media and entertainment options, there is more the NBA should do to better leverage its digital assets. A continuous stream of exclusive behind-the-scenes content during the All-Star weekend, fan engagement tools such as virtual face-to-face interactions with the players, or the capability to watch coaches and analysts explain their decisions during a match in real-time boosts fan engagement.

Lastly, for specific events such as dunk contests and three point contests, the NBA should come up with a new one. Ensuring past legends become guests and invitees of some of the segments, altering the rules of the game to create more complex forms of skating and dance, and raising the amounts awarded to the participants of those events would all improve the entertainment factor of those and the All-Star Game weekend as a whole.

5 CONCLUSION

For now, the NBA All-Star Game of the year 2024 is still as popular drawing the league's brightest stars for a weekend of spectacular basketball and fun. It remains relevant, which was influenced by the changes taking place within the NBA and the interest of international basketball enthusiasts. It is also necessary to revise the format of the competition to increase competitiveness. Offering donations to charity in the name of the deserving team and affecting the draft choices of the teams of participating players will act as a motivation to make the players play the game seriously. The next recommendation aims at making the voting system easier to understand; Instead of such a system, a more primitive mechanism with roots in fans but less in controversy and complications should be introduced; a weighted system along with the estimations of the professionals might be used.

The NBA can also be better at using its digital channels. During the All-Star weekend, mobile applications that engage fans with behind-the-scenes material, making it possible to facilitate virtual face-to-face meetings with the players or enjoy live streams of analysis sessions can help. Last of all,

where there are separate events like the dunk contest and the three-pointer contest more innovation is required. Letting the past legends join as part of specific features, the alteration of rules in order to extend creative performances, more challenge as well as the upturn of the bonuses awarded to performers will make such events more appealing and also will improve the interest to All-Star Game weekend.
